

# Submission Guidelines

### INTRODUCTION

The 6th edition of the European Climate Change Adaptation conference (ECCA) will take place in Dublin, 19–21 June 2023.

Held for the first time in Ireland, this conference's edition will bring together researchers, regional policy stakeholders, practitioners, decision makers and the creative community to discuss recent advances in climate change adaptation and knowledge for a climate resilient Europe.

Through sharing new research results, novel policy developments and practical implementation experiences, ECCA2023 seeks to inspire action along the six identified ECCA themes.

- 1. Stepping up Climate Action: Support through Climate Platforms and Services
- 2. Adaptation Responses to Sea Level Rise and Coastal Change
- 3. Nature-Based solutions for Climate Change Adaptation
- 4. Preparing for More Frequent and Severe Climate Extremes
- 5. Reframing Societal Transformation by Challenging Underlying Assumptions
- 6. Climate and Social Resilience of Future Energy Infrastructure and Systems

ECCA2023 will be an in-person event for up to 500 people with live streaming for online access and interaction.

#### **CALL FOR POSTERS**

Posters will be exhibited on both days of the conference in the ECCA Piazza. This central area is designed to be an adaptable, interactive communication space with a lively atmosphere, in the heart of conference activities. The ECCA Piazza will have online/hybrid operability and can be used for a range of interactive sessions. You will have the opportunity to present your poster in an active way.

Abstracts for posters must be submitted by 23:59 (CET) on 27 February 2023 indicating the theme to which you wish to contribute.

 Posters should highlight results of projects or activities dealing with the climate adaptation conference topics.  Abstracts should include a meaningful title, name and contact for the author(s) authors, and a short description of the poster's content (limited to 500 words).

The need for climate adaptation is increasingly recognised in arts, music, and performance. ECCA strives to present the latest artistic projects that address climate change and adaptation, inspiring and supporting climate action in a fresh, creative, and new way of thinking.

Abstracts for a photographic exhibition, art project, architectural idea and /or music/theatre performance must be submitted by 23:59 (CET) on <u>27 February 2023</u>. Your proposal should include:

- A meaningful title, name and contact for author(s)/artist(s)
- A short description of your planned type of activity (limited to 500 words),
- A budget outlining any costs and fees.

## CALL FOR INTEREST - Climate Adaptation Challenges and Solutions

Interactive formats can be facilitated either within a session dedicated to one of the 6 ECCA2023 themes, reflecting on specific challenges such as urban vulnerabilities, coastal adaptation, impacts of extremes or organised as an activity in the open ECCA Piazza. The ECCA Piazza is designed to be an adaptable, interactive communication space, in the heart of the conference activities, with a lively atmosphere. It will have online/hybrid operability and can be used for a range of interactive sessions.

Share your climate adaptation challenges and invite practical solution ideas or pitch your solution ideas to share lessons learning. Co-design your activity with a subgroup of scientists, politicians and/or practitioners. Present your project and /or joint efforts on the way to a climate resilient Europe.

Proposals must be submitted by 23:59 (CET) on <u>27 February 2023</u> indicating the theme to which you wish to contribute. Abstracts should include

- A meaningful title, name and contact data of authors,
- A short description outlining your proposed activity (limited to 500 words).
