

# How to create a narrated presentation in PowerPoint (E-poster voice-over)





#### What you will need

- A laptop or desktop PC
- A microphone (built-in mic on your device or if you have an external mic or headset)
- Microsoft PowerPoint and your E-poster presentation slide (or PPT for Mac)
- Presentation note or a script
  - this will help you to focus on what to say on each slide – print it out

#### **Good Practices & Guidelines**


- Keep it short!
  - Narrated presentation for ISMS 2023 E-posters should be a

# maximum of <u>2</u> minutes

- Use the E-poster guidelines to create your 1 slide PowerPoint file
- Once the poster slide is ready, then record your voice over and save as a PowerPoint file and also as a PDF (note the PDF will not have audio)





## To record your narration – Powerpoint 2016





#### To pause or continue the recording






#### Office 365 PowerPoint



Please note, newer versions of PowerPoint may appear different, but functions remain similar

#### Presenting tips


- Do not speak immediately when you push record, wait 3 seconds.
- You can still use animations etc.
- Don't click "record from beginning" once you have started or you will wipe over all your recordings!!!



- You can use the presentation mode tools to:
  - Point, highlight or write key aspects
  - Magnify to make a section of a slide bigger
  - Can also use "ctrl and hold left mouse click" for laser pointer


#### Check the recording when done

Make sure its maximum 2 minutes in total



### Save and Export the presentation as .mp4

- Go to File > Export > Create a video
- Select Full HD (1080p) or presentation quality (1920x1080) > Create > save as
- Follow upload instructions (will be sent via email at a later stage)
