

## Professor Francois Cilliers.

Francoise is Professor of Health Sciences Education at the Faculty of Health Sciences and in the Academic Development Programme at the Centre for Higher Education Development, both at the University of Cape Town. His interests include the learning effects of assessment; faculty development, particularly understanding the impact of faculty development and theory informing faculty development; and helping faculty undertake meaningful educational research.

He is involved in curriculum development and reform initiatives for medical, physiotherapy and occupational therapy programmes. He has facilitated planning workshops for academic programmes at undergraduate and postgraduate levels, as well as for academic departments.

Francois is the current President of the South African Association of Health Educationalists (SAAHE) and originated what has become the annual conference of the organisation. He runs the SAAHE Special Interest Groups in Assessment and Research. He is involved in the FAIMER Institute and previously with the Sub-Saharan African FAIMER Regional institute (SAFRI).

Francois is an associate editor with the African Journal for Health Professions Education and was previously an associate editor with the International Journal for Academic Development and with Perspectives on Medical Education. He reviews for a number of leading international health sciences education journals.
