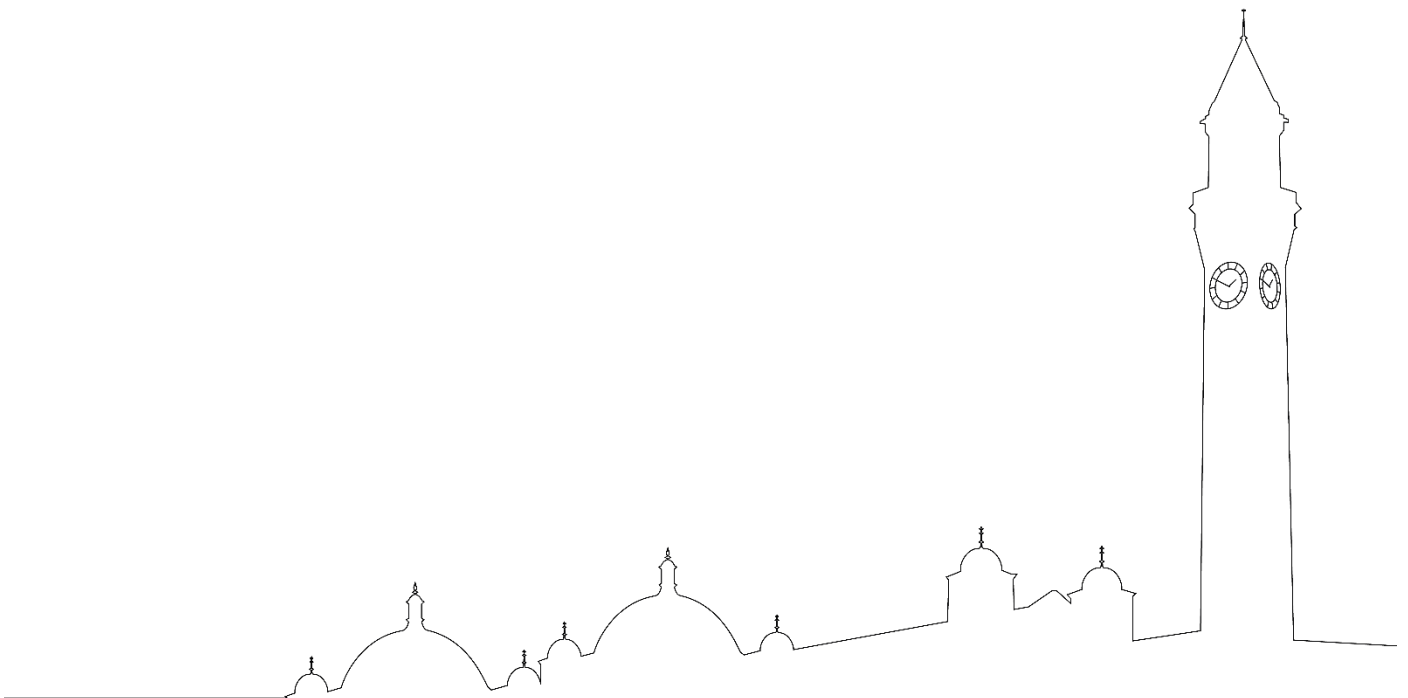

The International Society for Autonomic Neuroscience (ISAN) came to life at a meeting in Melbourne in 1994 to represent both academic and industrial scientists at the forefront of autonomic research. The common goal is to further understand the diversity of the autonomic nervous system and its dysfunction in disease processes. The Society Journal is Autonomic Neuroscience attracting papers covering both Basic & Clinical Autonomic Neuroscience.

ISAN 2024 will be the first meeting held in the UK since London in 2000 (following a world tour of North & South America, Europe, Japan and Australia). We invite you to join ISAN 2024 in Birmingham, UK for the chance to connect and network with 300-400 attendees from all over the world.

- Recent insights into the role of the vagus nerve in brain-gut communication and therapeutic implications of vagus nerve stimulation in the treatment of gastrointestinal disorders
- Targeting GI vasodilatory hormones for the treatment of postprandial syndromes in autonomic disorders
- Glucose sensing affecting autonomic activity – a new insight into neuronal control of metabolic homeostasis

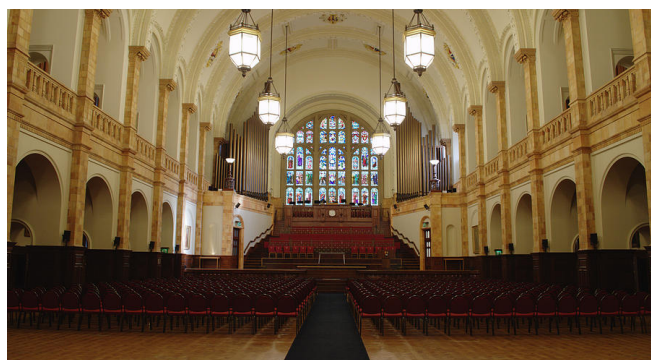
The Venue

Founded in 1900, the University of Birmingham was the UK's first civic university, where students from all religions and backgrounds were accepted on an equal basis. Today, it continues in the same innovative spirit as a World Top 100 University and a leading research institution.

ISAN 2024 will all be held on the central campus, with the conference sessions taking place in the Aston Webb Building, with the Bramall Concert Hall and Great Hall being the main venues for all sessions.

Great Hall

The Great Hall was originally built as a 'cathedral to learning', this building never fails to impress delegates and guests. This Grade II-listed red-brick hall was built in 1900 and has welcomed thousands of students for graduation ceremonies across the decades. Now it inspires delegates and visitors alike as one of the University's accredited Venues of Excellence.



The Bramall

The Bramall is the beating heart of music and entertainment at the University of Birmingham. Home to the University's Department of Music and state-of-the-art teaching and performance space, the building has attracted some of the finest musicians, comedians, and speakers in the world. When not hosting concerts and performances, the Bramall welcomes delegates from across the globe through its doors for standout events and conferences on campus. The configuration of the auditorium (also known as the Elgar Concert Hall) offers 419 seats.



Deliveries

We can only accept small deliveries before the conference date as we do not have any storage in the venue beforehand. Further details and information will be provided nearer the time including the address deliveries can be sent to.

Stall set-up

Stalls will be set up in the Great Hall. We will ask you to set-up your stall on the morning of Thursday 25th July as the venue is in use the day before. Breakdown will be required by the end of the conference on Saturday 27th July.

Gold £5,000 + VAT

Additional Sponsor Opportunities

Symposium Sponsorship £1,000 + VAT (per speaker)

This will cover or contribute to the cost of registration, accommodation and travel

- Funds can be paid either to the University of Birmingham conference account* who can reimburse speakers, or you can arrange alternative funds management with the symposium leads.
