DREAM, ACT, LEAD: THE FUTURE IS OURS

Girls and young women were in the epicentre of our attention when deciding the theme of our 38th World Conference. Their right to a bright future is the primary goal of our Guiding Movement, as defined by our vision for the next decade in Compass 2032. They can dream of the future; and the World Guiding Movement, through its Member Organizations, offers them the values and the experience they need to act, grow, thrive, and lead the effort for a better tomorrow; for their own lives, but also for the whole planet.

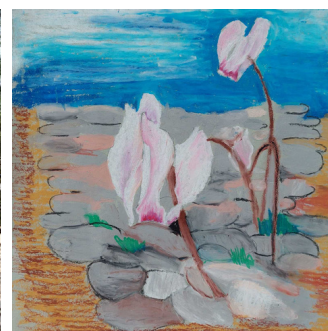
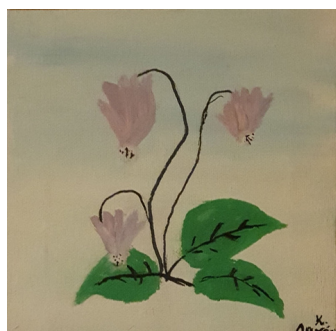
Our parallel commitment to sustainability was combined in the logo we chose for our World Conference.

It firstly incorporates light, symbolising the sun rising for our common future, as it shines in Cyprus an average of 2,700 to 3,500 hours per year, making our island literally the brightest country in Europe. And secondly our ethnic flower, the Cyprus Cyclamen (Cyclamen Cyprium) native to woodland at 300 to 1,200 metres elevation in the mountains.

Endemic to the island, first identified by the Austrian botanist Karl Georg Theodor Kotschy in 1862, this perennial, with its heart-shaped leaves, thrives also in the coastal cliffs, often finding an anchor in the crevices of rocks. To us symbolising how the beauty of nature is never weak, even if it looks so, but it can find and give life anywhere, even on a rock.

Cyclamen = from the Greek word Κύκλος = Circle also symbolising the circle of never-ending life, and the never-ending bond we Guides share, as we meet seeking to live happy days together.

Our logo is based on a painting created by 9-year-old Danae Constantinidou, the winner of a competition we organised for this purpose among our young Members.

Cyprus is among the first countries where Guiding existed right after the birth of the Movement.

According to our archives, among them a letter signed by the Chief Guide Olave Baiden Powell, Girl Guiding thrived in Cyprus from 1912 onwards, when the island was a British colony. The Girl Guides Association of Cyprus was founded in 1960, the year of the Independence. In 1962 GGAC became an associate Member of WAGGGS, and it was recognised as full Member in 1978, at the World Conference organised in Iran.

We are a girls-only organisation, and the only women-only youth association in Cyprus, well recognized for the educational methods we apply, our innovative programs, and our projects that give girls and young women the opportunity to make a difference in society. We are proud of our long history, as GGAC was, for example, the first NGO that four decades ago acted in promoting awareness for respecting and protecting the environment.

We offer our members non-formal education and training, but also the opportunity for social work, creative experiences, and lots of fun activities in nature, like camps at our two campsites, one in Governor's Beach by the sea and one in Troodos mountains.

BOOK ONLINE THROUGH OUR WEBSITE!

Registrations for the 38th World Conference will be opening on 19 January 2023! Registrations can be completed online through the dedicated Conference website. The link to register will be shared with you on 19 January 2023.

Registration will be available in Arabic, English, French and Spanish. You will be able to register more than one attendee at the same time, but you will be required to provide all of their information at that time. You will need to use a unique email address for each of the attendees you register. This is so all attendees are kept informed with 38th World Conference updates and if we need personal information, we can reach out directly to each attendee.

CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY



Registration fees are non-refundable. However, they can be transferred to another person until 1 June 2023. To transfer the registration, you will need to send us an email with the details of the new attendee at WoCo@waggs.org.

After 1 June 2023, substitution cannot be arranged, and the registration fee will be forfeited. In case of unforeseeable circumstances, please contact WAGGGS by email WoCo@waggs.org immediately.



OFFICIAL DELEGATIONS

During the registration process you will need to send the World Conference Planning Team your MO's official delegation list. You will be asked to upload the official delegation list in the 'MO Information' section. To upload the official delegation list, you need to click the 'browse' button, then you can select the document from your files.

Your MO official delegation list should:

- be on MO headed paper and signed by the IC/CC.
- indicate who is the Head Delegate, Delegate and Observers.

If you encounter any difficulties with uploading your official delegation list, please email WoCo@waggs.org for support.

WAGGGS will review all registrations and confirm roles outlined on the provided MO delegation list. Once your registration is confirmed, you will be sent a link to pay the registration fees online.

Each Full or Associate Member Organisation of WAGGGS in the Region is entitled to send two Delegates appointed from within its membership. The Delegates carry the authority of their Member Organisation to speak and vote on its behalf and are expected to participate in all proceedings.

In addition, Member Organisations may send up to 8 Observers who act in support of their Delegates.



GRANTS

Grants will be available to support Member Organisations to participate in the 38th World Conference.

The grants for the 38th World Conference can support representatives of Member Organisations with funding towards some of the following costs:

- Registration fee
- Accommodation
- Travel

When reviewing grant applications, the following criteria will be taken into account:

- Ensuring the Conference has a quorum
- Member Organisations otherwise not represented at Conference
- Young women aged under 30 on the first day of the Conference (July 26, 2023)

You can apply for a grant to participate in the 38th World Conference when registering before 28 February 2023. All applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application before the end of March 2023.

The allocation of grants will also be subject to the following conditions:

1. The Member Organisation is not suspended and is up to date with membership fee payments i.e. has paid its 2022 membership fees.
2. Grants cannot be transferred to another person. In exceptional circumstances, a Member Organisation may apply for a change of beneficiary. The deadline for this request is 1 June 2023.
3. If the recipient of the grant does not attend the conference, the grant must be reimbursed in its entirety to WAGGGS.
4. Feedback on the experience will be required at or after the conference in a format which will be confirmed at a later date.

TRAVEL & VISAS

Travel to Cyprus

The legal ports of entry into the Republic of Cyprus are the international airports of Larnaca and Paphos which are situated in the area under the effective control of the Government of the Republic of Cyprus.

- Larnaca Airport is approximately a 40 minute (48km) drive from the meeting venue.
- Paphos Airport is approximately a 1 hour and 30 minute (140km) drive from the meeting venue.

Entry into the territory of the Republic of Cyprus via any other airport in the area of Cyprus in which the Government of the Republic does not exercise effective control (Turkish occupied area) **is illegal**.

Please note that delegates will be expected to arrange their own travel bookings to Cyprus.

Cyprus is easily accessible as it is linked with numerous direct and connecting flights with all the main European cities, Middle East, Africa and Asian countries.

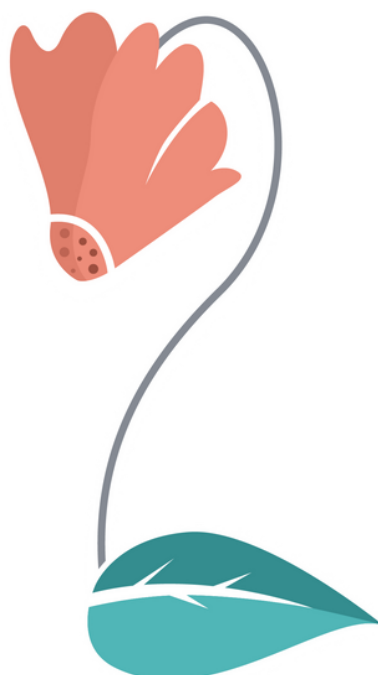

Transport from the Airport

All hotel choices that are located in Nicosia or Larnaca are only a short transfer away.

You will be met on arrival at the airport and transferred to your hotel, free of cost!

In order to assist us, please wear your uniform or a Girl Guide/Girl Scout scarf for easy identification upon your arrival at the airport.





TRAVEL & VISAS

Visa Information

EU countries, commonwealth countries and the USA do NOT need a visa.
Schengen Visa holders are allowed to enter the Republic of Cyprus.

- Citizens of these countries are not required to have Cyprus visa for a stay of up to 90 days
- Citizens of these countries are required to have an entry visa to Cyprus

You will need to apply for a visa through your country's Cypriot Consulate, Embassy or High Commission.

Steps for Application Process:

- Apply for a visa in your country of residence – Find the Cyprus embassy/high-commission/consulate or visa application centre (authorised by the Cypriot authorities) in which you must submit your application on this website here: <https://mfa.gov.cy/embassies,-high-commissions,-consulates-general-and-honorary-consulates-by-country.html>
- Find out about the entry requirements.
- Complete your visa application.
- Contact them to make an appointment.
- Collect the required documents.
- Submit the application along with the required (supporting) documents on the date of your appointment.
- Pay the visa fee.
- Wait for the visa to be processed.
- Pick up your passport and documents. If your application was successful, the embassy/consular staff will affix your visa to your passport. If your application has been refused you will be notified in writing with the reasons for the refusal.

GGAC has organised a special visa fee for the World Conference. If you require a visa support letter, please let us know during the registration process. GGAC will issue an invitation letter and a special pricing code for you to present when applying for a visa. We ask that you do this by **3 April 2023** to ensure adequate time to prepare the letter and for you to apply for your visa.

To find the visa application form as well as the list of Embassies, Consulates and Visa Application Centres, visit the Republic of Cyprus Ministry of Foreign Affairs website: www.mfa.gov.cy

If you are transiting through another country on your way to Cyprus, you must check if you need a transit visa for this purpose.

Insurance

It is the responsibility of the individual to ensure that they have adequate and appropriate insurance to cover: personal property, travel disruption, injury, medical expenses, general liability and life cover for the period of travel to, travel from and during the stay at the 38th World Conference. As an organisation, WAGGGS holds public/general liability insurance coverage that is reviewed regularly.

Neither GGAC nor WAGGGS can take responsibility for any medical, accident or personal property claims by World Conference participants (other than those that may fall under public liability). WAGGGS will also not be liable for travel costs in the event of cancellation of the event for any reason.

European University Cyprus, Nicosia

The 38th World Conference will take place at the European University Cyprus in Nicosia.

The European University Cyprus (EUC) is a private university in Nicosia which evolved out of Cyprus College, the oldest institution of higher education in Cyprus. Rising in the rankings, European University Cyprus has been gaining local, regional and global acknowledgement for their efforts to be a student-focused and innovative institution, with an emphasis on an international orientation, sustainability and industry/community engagement. With a history of more than 60 years, European University Cyprus has grown into a leading academic and research institution in the region with Schools of Medicine, Sciences, Business, Law, and Humanities, Social & Education Sciences and a Distance Education Unit.

It also hosts the only Microsoft Innovation Centre in Cyprus. www.euc.ac.cy



The main room (plenary room) is called Culture Centre and will host most of the Conference sessions.



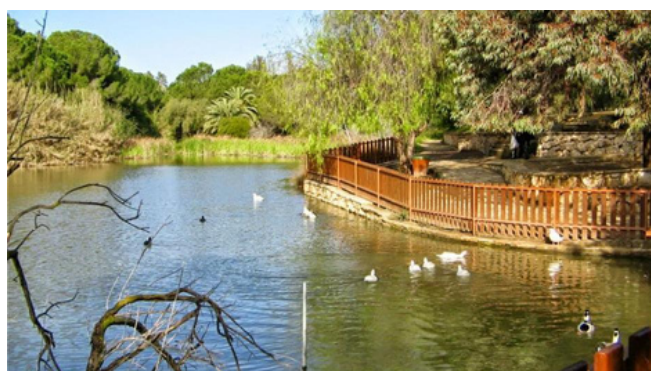
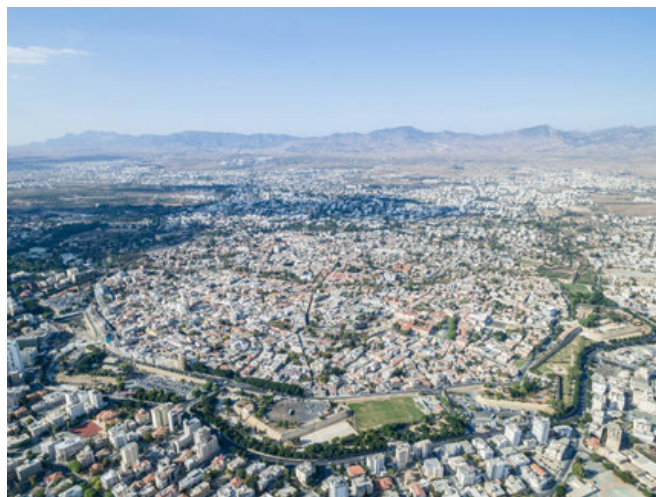
VENUE

The venue also includes more than 20 smaller rooms that will be used for parallel sessions and meetings.



The university campus is located in the modern, up-scale area of Engomi close to restaurants, museums, shops, sports venues and fitness centres. Numerous cinemas, shops, pharmacies and hospitals as well as the Nicosia Mall are located just minutes away from the venue.

The shopping scene of the city has been enhanced with three modern malls and additional high street venues. Nicosia, with its unique landmarks, has an active events calendar with concerts, and festivals throughout the year. The Pedieos walking trail, which runs the length of the city and ends right in its heart, as well as the Athalassa National Park offer an excellent opportunity for relaxing walks or challenging workouts on foot or by bike in nature.

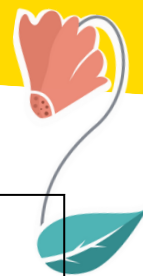

Language

Greek and Turkish are the official languages. English is widely spoken. French, German, Russian are also spoken within the tourism industry.

Communication

At the 38th World Conference, we welcome our friends from all over the world. This means that many people will be speaking and working in their second or third language. We ask everybody to make an effort to speak clearly and slowly. At any time, please feel free to ask people to slow down or to repeat anything you did not understand.

Health

We recommend you visit your doctor for advice regarding immunisations and medicine you should consider for the trip. Mosquitoes are present all year round and insect repellent, along with appropriate clothing to wear at dusk and dawn, are advisable.

Weather

July in Cyprus is one of the hottest months of the year. The weather is very warm with an average high-temperature of 37.2°C (99°F) and an average low-temperature of 22.2°C (72°F).

Photographs During the Conference

A photographer will be on-site taking photographs throughout the conference, so please indicate on the registration form, if you have any objections to being photographed or filmed.

Currency

The currency in Cyprus is the Euro (€). All banks exchange major currencies (e.g. US dollar, British sterling pound, Swiss franc, Russian ruble etc.) in Euro. A bank is located at the exit of the arrival hall at Larnaca or Paphos airport (just after Customs control). An ATM can also be found in the venue.

Electricity

The plug type in Cyprus is G (of British origin), which is the plug that has three rectangular pins in a triangular pattern. Cyprus operates on a 230V supply voltage, at 50Hz. Many hotels offer Universal Plugs and USB chargers in their rooms. Some hotels offer adapters at the reception (with deposit). Please make sure to have an adapter ready though, if you might need to charge your device during the conference.
